Our local police departments offer a variety of tools to help keep residents informed and connected when it comes to community safety. Four of those tools are highlighted below. We encourage you to consider signing up for these services! You can learn more on the [Safe Schools page](#) of our D181 website.

Nixle Email and Text Alerts: Nixle is a system that allows police departments to push out email and/or text alerts to those who sign up. Registration is free and can be done through links on the police department websites, or you can text your zip code to 888777 to opt-in. Alerts include critical notices such as a missing child, community threat, or severe weather.

Code Red Mobile App: Code Red is an application for iPhone and Android that allows registrants to receive critical alerts, similar to the Nixle system. Code Red also offers a mapping feature, so you can receive alerts occurring in any area you are visiting where the local department uses the service. It is a free app, but the weather warning add-on tool is a paid feature.

Smart 911 Enhanced Emergency Calling: Smart 911 is a free public safety service that enhances the information a 911 call provides during an emergency. DuPage County residents are encouraged to create a profile at Smart911.com. The profile information a user chooses to share about family

members, pets, the home, and vehicles displays automatically on the 911 call taker's screen if the user makes an emergency call. This can be particularly helpful to track a 911 call made from a cell phone, to access a photo of a child who is missing, to know who may be in a home experiencing a house fire, or to understand a medical situation if a person is unresponsive.

Block Watch: Block Watch is a program used by the Hinsdale Police Department to enlist the help of residents who have home outdoor video cameras to solve neighborhood crimes, as a home video system may have captured a picture of a suspect or a vehicle that can be a valuable lead to help in an investigation. Residents who have outdoor surveillance cameras are asked to register their cameras with the police department through the online form on their website.
