

Intermediate Bibliography Guidelines Based on MLA 7

Book

1. Author. (Last Name, First Name)
2. *Title of the Book*. (*italicized*, underlined if handwritten)
3. City of publication:
4. Publisher,
5. Year of publication. (copyright)
6. Print. (Includes print or digital books)

Example of book with one author:

Harris, Grant. *America's Very Own Ghosts*. New York: Scholastic Press, 2006. Print.

Example of book with no author:

The New Way Things Work. Boston: Houghton Mifflin. 2001. Print.

Example of book with two authors:

Ryan, William and Nancy Duncan. *Egyptian Gods and Goddesses*. New York: Doubleday, 2007. Print.

Example of book with no author listed, with editor:

Johnston, Jeffrey., ed. *Rocks and Minerals*. Chicago: Macmillan, 2011. Print.

Encyclopedia

1. Author of article. (if available) (Last name, First name)
2. "Title of Article."
3. *Title of Book* or *Title of Online source*. (*italicized*)
4. Date of edition or date you visited the website
5. Print or Web.

Example of encyclopedia article with author:

DiMarco, Matthew. "Franklin, Benjamin." *The World Book Encyclopedia*. 2009. Print.

Example of encyclopedia article without author:

"Coral Reefs." *Groliers Encyclopedia*. 2005. Print.

Example of online encyclopedia article:

Johnson, Mary. "Egypt." *Encyclopædia Britannica Online School Edition*. Encyclopædia Britannica, 2011. Web. 9 Mar. 2011.

Magazine Article

1. Author (if available) (Last Name, First Name)
2. "Title of Article."
3. *Magazine Title. (italicized)*
4. Magazine issue date (for print) or date you visited the website
5. Page number/s. (for print)
6. Print or Web.

Example of print magazine, no author:

"N.F.L. Training Camp Report." *Time Magazine for Kids*. 21 Aug. 2010: 20-22. Print.

Example of print magazine with article author:

Kelly, Colleen. "The Man Who Built the White House - Twice." *American History*. Dec 2000: 46-54. Print.

Example of online magazine with article author:

"Superbowl XLV: How Did the Ads Measure Up." *Newsweek*. Web. 5 Feb. 2011.

Example of online magazine with article author:

Poniewozik, James. "Groupon: We Meant to Do That." *Time*. Web. 10 Feb. 2011.

Website

1. Author of article. (if available)
2. "Title of Article."
3. *Title of Website. (italicized)*
4. Web. (to show it was found online)
5. Date you visited the website. (dd/m/year)

Example of website with article author:

Smith, Mary. "The History of Ancient Egypt." *The Ancient Egypt Site*. Web. 8 Feb. 2011.

Example of website with no article author:

"The History of Ancient Egypt." *The Ancient Egypt Site*. Web. 8 Feb. 2011.

Online Video

1. "Title of Video."
2. Creator of Video.
3. *Website title. (Italicized)*
4. Year of publication
5. Web (to show it was found online)
6. Date you visited the website. (dd/m/year)

Examples of online video:

Ellsworth, Barbara. "Keyboarding Techniques" *Ellsworth Publishing Co.* 2008. Web. 14 July 2011.

Sudac, Lindsey "How to Use the Library" *YouTube*. 28 July 2009. Web. 14 July 2011.

Example of online video, no author:

"The Basics of In-Text Citations" Online Posting. *YouTube*. 21 Aug 2008. Web. 4 July 2011.

Digital Image

1. *Title of Image or description (Italicize)*
2. Digital image. (to indicate it is a photo)
3. *Title of website where image was found (italicize)*
4. Web. (to show you found it online)
5. Date you found the image. (dd/m/year)

Example of digital image:

Typical Baseball Game. Digital image. Web. 3 Feb. 2011.
